Purpose

This policy is designed to protect all individuals, particularly children and at-risk adults, from harm caused by First Year Africa's staff, associates, programmes, or operations. It reinforces First Year Africa's commitment to creating a safe, respectful, and nurturing environment for everyone we interact with.

Scope

This policy applies to:

- All staff, permanent and temporary
- Volunteers and interns
- Consultants, contractors, and agency staff
- Trustees and board members
- Donors, media personnel, project visitors, and any third parties associated with First Year Africa
- Partners, vendors, and other third parties, when referenced in contracts, agreements, or MoUs

It does not apply to external organisations unless explicitly agreed upon.

Guiding Principles

First Year Africa commits to:

- 1. **Do No Harm**: Uphold the safety and dignity of all individuals.
- 2. **Zero Tolerance**: No abuse, exploitation, or harassment will be tolerated.
- 3. **Inclusivity**: Protect individuals irrespective of age, gender, ethnicity, disability, or sexual orientation.
- 4. Transparency: Ensure clear reporting and accountability mechanisms.
- 5. **Survivor-Centred Approach**: Prioritise the needs, rights, and safety of survivors.

Approach

First Year Africa will address safeguarding through four pillars:

1. Prevention

- Embed safeguarding into programme design and operations.
- Conduct thorough staff and partner vetting.
- Provide mandatory safeguarding training.

2. Reporting

- o Maintain accessible, confidential reporting channels.
- Require all staff and associates to report concerns promptly.

3. Response

- o Investigate and address all reports swiftly and fairly.
- o Support survivors through a survivor-centred approach.

4. Learning

- o Regularly review safeguarding practices to improve case management.
- o Share lessons across teams and partners.

Policy Statement

First Year Africa is committed to protecting the rights of children and at-risk adults by:

- Ensuring all individuals have equal protection from harm.
- Prohibiting sexual activity with individuals under 18 years old, irrespective of the local age of consent.
- Addressing any imbalance of power between staff, associates, and beneficiaries.

Staff Responsibilities

All staff and associates are required to:

- Report safeguarding concerns within 24 hours.
- Respect boundaries and avoid situations where abuse of power could occur.
- Uphold confidentiality except when reporting concerns through appropriate channels.

Prohibited behaviours include:

- Engaging in discriminatory or exploitative actions.
- Developing inappropriate relationships with beneficiaries.
- Neglecting to report safeguarding breaches.
